


If you remain on the home page (the one above) and scroll down to the 'The Other Stuff Section,' it should have the following information:


- → Vocabulary Exam Dates & Current PowerPoint Overviews



If you visit Canvas (our LMS), you will find a course on the dashboard that says, 'AP Language & Composition.' Select that icon on the dashboard. It should look something like this:




After you see this, you have two options:
