

If you visit my teacher website, there are multiple resources available for your reference. When you go to the website, it should look something like this:



Once you see this page, you have a few options: (1) You can select the '<u>AP Literature</u>' tab and reference the posted coursework; (2) You could check out the '<u>Vocabulary</u>' page if you are checking in on vocabulary lessons; (3) You could select the '<u>Grammar</u>' page if you are referencing grammatical lessons; (4) OR you can continue scrolling down to 'The Other Stuff' on the home page.

If you remain on the home page (the one above) and scroll down to the 'The Other Stuff Section,' it should have the following information:


- → Vocabulary Exam Dates & Current PowerPoint Overviews






For the vocabulary, look for the file download that says, 'AP English Unit [X] Vocabulary.' For the journal prompts, use the arrows in the upper right-hand corner to flip through the slides. 
If you visit Canvas (our LMS), you will find a course on the dashboard that says, 'AP Literature & Composition.' Select that icon on the dashboard. It should look something like this:



Once you select that course from the dash, it should look something like the snapshot to the right (above).

After you see this, you have two options: (1) You can select 'Modules' in the upper left side of the webpage (see arrow above); (2) You can scroll down until you see, 'Modules & Archives & Collections & Such.'
