

## First Person P.O.V.



- A character within the story recounts his or her own experiences or impressions.
- Lets the reader know only what the character knows
- Uses the pronouns "I" and "We"

## Second Person P.O.V.



- The story is told from the perspective of you.
- Sometimes used in poetry
- Uses the pronoun "you"

3 Types

## **Third Person Objective**





- The narrator remains a detached observer, telling only the story's action and dialogue.
- Lets the reader know only what is seen and heard, <u>not</u> what characters think or feel.
- Uses the pronouns:
  He, She, It, and They
- How many characters? NONE

## Third Person Limited Omniscient



B

- The narrator tells the story from the viewpoint of one character in the story.
- Lets the reader know what one character thinks, sees, knows, hears, and feels
- Uses the pronouns:He, She, It, and They
- How many characters? ONE

# Third Person Omniscient





- The narrator has unlimited knowledge and can describe every character's thoughts and interpret their behaviors.
- Lets the reader know unlimited information about the characters.
- Uses the pronouns:He, She, It, and They
- How many characters? MANY
